Taking over of MAMC

839. SHRI TAPAN KUMAR SEN:

Will the Minister of HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that after taking over of the Mining and Allied Machineries Corporation (MAMC) after its liquidation by the Consortium of three CPSUs, viz, BEML, CIL and DVC, the production activities have already been started;
- (b) if so, from which date and the products being manufactured by the new company; and
- (c) if not, why no initiative has been taken/activities initiated even after more than a decade of the company's liquidation?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HEAVY INDUSTRIES AND PUBLIC ENTERPRISES (SHRI BABUL SUPRIYO)

(a): MAMC is in liquidation since march/April, 2005. Ministry of Heavy Industries & Public Enterprises has no administrative control over MAMC being in liquidation and BEML, CIL and DVC are also not under the administrative control of Ministry of Heavy industries & Public Enterprises.

(b): Does not arise in view of para (a) above.

(c): As stated in para (a) above, Ministry of Heavy industries & Public Enterprises has no administrative control over MAMC being in liquidation.
