

The performance highlights of the Department of Heavy Industry for the month of July, **2013**:-

I Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd. (BHEL)

(a) Order Booking:

The total order receipts in the current financial year up-to July 2013 has reached a level of **Rs.2381 Crs.** which include orders worth **Rs. 918 Crs.** booked during July 2013.

Major orders received during the month include:

(i) Power Sector:

- ❖ Order worth **Rs 289 Crs** for
 - Repair of HP Module, IP Rotor & IP Casing of Korba-East, Chhatisgarh SEB.
 - Dismantling and E&C of ESP Pass A & B of Raichur, UNIT#8, KPCL.
 - Supply of Generator Stator of Rashtriya Ispat Nigam (RINL), Vizag.

(ii) Industry Sector:

- ❖ Order worth **Rs 613 Crs** for
 - Supply of 3 x 34.5 MW Frame 6B Gas Turbine Generator sets from BPCL Kochi Refinery, Kerala
 - 76/62 Super Rapid Gun Mount from Pipavav Shipyard

(iii) International Operations:

- ❖ Orders worth **Rs. 16 Crs** for
 - Supply of Rotor & Repair of Existing Rotor for compressor from France.
 - Spares and Services from Indonesia, Iraq, Oman & Bhutan.
 - Sudan – Unit-1 of 4 X 125 MW Kosti Power Plant attained maximum possible load of 90MW with the alternate fuel -Heavy Furnace Oil (HFO).
 - Belarus – Successful completion of 72 hours Reliability Run of 126 MW Grodno Co-gen Power Plant.

(b) R&D:

BHEL spent around **Rs.72 Crores** on R&D initiatives during July'13 and filed 40 **Patents/ Copyrights.**

II NTPC-BHEL Power Projects Private Limited (NBPPPL):

The cumulative turnover of NBPPPL is Rs. 29.90 Crore up to July, 2013 in the current financial year.

III. Automotive Sector:

- (a)** The Hon'ble Prime Minister held a meeting of the High Level Committee on manufacturing (HLCM) on 9th July, 2013. The meeting was attended by the Hon'ble Minister (HI&PE) & Secretary, Heavy

Industry. Along with other relevant issues, the subject of alternative fuel based transport involving electric and hybrid mobility was also discussed. The meeting endorsed the launch of pilot project for public transport of electric/ hybrid vehicles in Delhi followed by other metros after obtaining necessary approvals.

- (b) Acknowledging that electric vehicles do not generate pollution while mobbing and they are the key to low carbon transport, it was observed that the India has the potential to emerge as a global manufacturing hub for electric/ hybrid vehicles. It was decided that the pilot project would be implemented by cities specified SPVs. The first pilot project in Delhi would be targeted for launch in August. The Inter-Ministerial Group will be constituted by DHI to work out implementation modalities of the pilot project.

IV Performance of major PSEs

A brief tabular statement on the performance of some of the major CPSEs under the Department of Heavy Industry is enclosed at Annex-I. The production of these companies upto **June, 2013** was -23.05 % lower as compared to the corresponding period last year.
